Rabbi's February Message

As most of you know or should know, my loving wife Deborah and I started a jazz label in 2012. Now entering its Bar Mitzvah year, it has been an extraordinary journey, meeting amazing, virtuoso, and skillful musicians, award winning artists and performers.

Recently, I received an amazing opportunity to release an album by the great Sheila Jordan, an award-winning vocalist, and NEA Jazz Master. Without consulting with my company directors, marketing people or financial staff, without hesitation I said yes. When asked I said it was personal, and after hearing my reason, everyone understood and appreciated my action.

Let me explain. Sheila Jordan is just a few months older than my mother, 96 years young. She has led a complicated and difficult life, and has survived because she found music, and became one of the most creative singer-songwriters in the jazz genre. Google her, you will find an amazing history. Now at 96, she in embarking on another chapter of her life. She states that at her current age, she still has a story to tell, relevant to the times and her experience. As her vocal prowess may no longer be at the apex of her abilities, her emotion is the vehicle that still transports to the listener.

As I have watched my mother's mental health decline these past 4 years, I reflected that through her eighties and into her nineties she was fiercely independent, making decisions, volunteering at the cancer center, attending city council meetings, and assisting numerous charities. She accompanied those in need of assistance to doctors, lawyers, keeping notes on their behalf, running errands for those who were shut ins. She was on the Bikur Cholim (hospital visitation) squad and frankly, it was embarrassing, because her energy would run rings around her three children. She too, like Sheila, desperately fights to stay relevant, even as her mental faculties diminished and her dementia increased. There is a wonderful movie that I suggest all to watch, and it is called "Quartet." I believe it was Dustin Hoffman's directorial debut. The film also stars the late great Maggie Smith, Billy Connally and a star filled cast. Many of the supporting and background cast in the film's "retirement home for former professional musicians" were portrayed by actual professional musicians, as illustrated by then-and-now photos during the closing credits. The film is about Beecham House, a retirement home for former professional musicians patterned after the real-life Casa di Riposo per Musicisti founded by Giuseppe Verdi. All the guests in the retirement home are suffering in varying degrees from the ailments that old age can bring, but continue to be engaged in their former professions, including lecturing and introducing young people to music. The major point of the movie is that these once highly talented artists are trying to cope with aging and remaining relevant. The acting and music are splendid. Highly recommended!




